

**Report on the Field Work**  
B.Com. 3<sup>rd</sup> Semester (Major & General Course)  
Subject: Environmental Studies  
Paper: 301

**Syllabus Guideline:**

All students of B. Com. 3<sup>rd</sup> Semester, Major and General Courses are required to undertake a Field Work equal to 5 lecture hours for the Environmental Studies paper where they have to undertake some of the following activities-

- a) Visit a local area to document environmental assets such as river, forest grassland, hill etc.
- b) Visit to a local polluted site of an urban/rural/industrial/agricultural background.
- c) Study of common plants, insects and birds.
- d) Study of simple ecosystems of a pond, river and hill slopes etc.

The students are required to submit a Report based on their findings after visiting such a place. A total of 25 marks are allotted to that report for every student in his/her final assessment as per guidelines prescribed by Gauhati University.

**a) Year 2015-2016**

**Title of the Project:** A Study on the biodiversity of Deepar Beel.

**Outcome:** A Total of 115 students consisting of 20 Accountancy Major, 47 Management Major, 31 Finance Major and 17 General course students of the B.Com. 3<sup>rd</sup> Semester carried out the field visit to nearby Deepar Beel (Lake) under the guidance of teachers of different departments of the college. Students greatly enjoyed the 'outside the class learning' environment. Later they submitted detailed field study report highlighting environmental status, concerns of the lake after consulting the concerned teacher of the subject at the college.

**b) Year 2016-2017**

**Title of the Project:** A Study on the ecosystem and biodiversity of greater Kopili area.

**Outcome:** A Total of 112 students consisting of 39 Accountancy Major, 26 Management Major, 38 Finance Major and 9 General course students of the

B.Com. 3<sup>rd</sup> Semester carried out the field visit to Kopili, Rani, situated at a distance of around 16 KM from the college, under the guidance of college faculty. The students later submitted detailed reports highlighting ecosystem and biodiversity of the area along Kopili river.

**c) Year 2017-2018**

**Title of the Project:**

Solid waste and its impact on environment: a study in Dharapur market area.

**Outcome:** A Total of 108 students consisting of 46 Accountancy Major, 36 Management Major, 19 Finance Major and 7 General course students of the B.Com. 3<sup>rd</sup> Semester carried out the field visit to nearby Dharapur market area under the guidance of teachers of the college. Later the students submitted detailed field study report based on their observation and findings.

**d) Year 2018-2019**

**Title of the Project:** A study on the biodiversity of the greater Ukiam area near Boko.

**Outcome:** A Total of 87 students consisting of 21 Accountancy Major, 14 Management Major, 43 Finance Major and 9 General course students of the B.Com. 3<sup>rd</sup> Semester carried out the field visit to Ukiam near Biko under the guidance of teachers of the college. Later the students submitted detailed field study report based on their observation and findings.

**e) Year 2019-20**

**Title of the Project:** A study on the forest eco-system and biodiversity of Chandubi Beel (Lake).

**Outcome:** A Total of 94 students consisting of 34 Accountancy Major, 24 Management Major, 32 Finance Major and 4 General course students of the B.Com. 3<sup>rd</sup> Semester carried out the field visit to Chandubi Lake to study the eco-system of the water body which is created as a result of a strong earthquake. Teachers from the college accompanied the students to the place and concerned teacher of the Environmental Studies explained the rich

biodiversity of the area to the students. Later the students submitted detailed field study report based on their observation and findings.
